

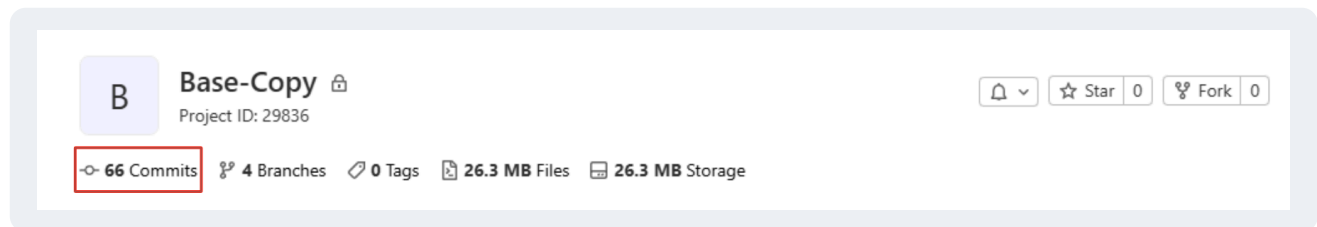
Gradescope Submissions

Submitting on Gradescope

Since you'll be working in a single repository over the course of the semester, we need you to be able to tell us which "version" of your code you want us to look at. Rather than using GitLab's autotesters, for each project, you will submit a commit hash to Gradescope.

Instructions

- Make sure your most recent changes are committed and pushed to your GitLab repository, on some branch.
- Click on the Commits tab on your repository page to view your commit history.



- ▶ If you want to submit a commit from another branch, click "Branches" first to navigate to the branch your commit is on.
- ▶ Alternatively, you can obtain recent commit hashes by running `git log` from your repository directory.
- When you open the commit you want to submit, the URL will look like: `https://gitlab.caltech.edu/cs121-26/wi/REPO_NAME/-/commit/8cf465d7c896b00b3a1ff30f3cc24daf6db5576`. The last 40 hexadecimal characters are the commit hash, which uniquely identify a snapshot of your repository.
- Copy paste the full hash of the commit you would like to submit into a text document named `commit.txt`, and submit that to Gradescope.
 - ▶ The file must be named **exactly** `commit.txt`!
